

# REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

# "You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition."

This Sunday, we return to Mark's Gospel after the five Sundays in which we heard the Bread of Life discourse. The readings largely dwell on the role of laws in our lives. The first reading from **Deuteronomy** (4:1-2,6-8), presents before us Moses speaking to the people of Israel the statutes and ordinances as they are about to enter into the promised land. These teachings aim to form a people worthy of a relationship with God that could become the core of their faith. These are teachings given to form the character of the people of God and prevent people from easily slipping back into their old and comfortable behaviors.

The second reading from the letter of James (1:17-18, 21-22,27) offers a stunning image of God's word planted in the depths of our hearts, given as a gift to us to produce fruits. James elaborates further how our care for the most vulnerable serves as the measuring rod for how well we are putting into action the saving word that we hear. It is not enough to experience love within our hearts; love must find expression in outward deeds.

In the gospel today (Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23) Jesus addresses the Pharisees, who criticize His disciples for not following traditional rituals. Jesus responds by highlighting that true defilement comes from within, not from external practices. The Pharisees were fixated on strict observance, missing the law's true purpose – bringing people closer to God. Jesus emphasizes the importance of inner purity and genuine faith, urging us to focus on our hearts and relationship with God. Jesus teaches that what matters most is our inner purity. We should focus on our hearts and minds, not just external practices. By keeping our thoughts and actions pure, we live in a way that honors God. Holiness comes from within and is evidenced in the actions and attitudes that emerge from a person's life.

Jesus' words challenge us as well. In our desire to show that we are holy, we might also give too much credence to externals, following rules without thinking about the intention behind them. Jesus reminds us that we do not make ourselves holy by our actions. Rather, we become holy when we allow God's Spirit to transform us. Our actions should be an expression of the conversion of our heart to God and to God's ways.

We do not come to faith instantly nor do we come to faith without suffering. We come to believe because we are willing to gamble on the reality that Jesus alone has the words of eternal life. The vision the National Eucharistic Congress set is one of mission. We cannot be spectators! As believers, we are the ones who will take God's words into our neighborhoods and beyond.
