Reflections from Fr. Matthew

"Whoever eats this Bread will live forever." (John 6:51)

As we continue to reflect the teachings of Jesus on the Eucharist through the "Bread of Life Discourse," this Sunday we are reading from the gospel of John Chapter 6, verses 41-51. We begin hearing the murmurings of the listeners as Jesus tells them that He is the Bread of Life, came down from heaven, and this Bread is leading them to eternal life, if they believe in the one who was sent by the Father. They could not understand how Jesus, the carpenter's son, could be God's Son. They could only see him as a human being, at most, a prophet who had some miraculous powers.

Jesus continues to teach them by quoting the prophets, "They shall all be taught by God." He is telling them that he himself is the manna given by God. He is the bread sent down from heaven. He gives life where death before was a certainty. He sustains us through this pilgrimage of earthly life until we can enter the fullness of God's promises. He fulfills the work of God in the Old Testament, while also surpassing it by far. While those who ate manna still died, eating this living bread will give life eternal. This was utterly mysterious for Jesus' hearers, for whom the concept of Eucharist did not yet exist. It remains mysterious for us now. Partaking in the Eucharist is a radical act of trust in the God who made us and loves us and wants abundant life for us.

Like prophet Elijah in the first reading today, the Lord feeds us miraculously in the Eucharist to nourish and sustain us for the long pilgrimage of Christian life. The Psalm invites us both to taste and see God's goodness and points our attention to the gift of Christ's presence in the eucharistic species, which we do in fact experience with both our taste and our sight. As St. Paul reminds us in the second reading, we are anointed by the Holy Spirit of God and sealed for the day of redemption. The Holy Spirit enables us to believe and live the Eucharistic life as we partake in the most beautiful gift of God- the Eucharist.

The year of mission is about sitting at the feet of Jesus, gazing upon him, and recognizing how he freely gives himself away over and over again. The more time we spend in his Presence, the more our own hearts are healed, converted, formed, and united so that we can go out into the world, to speak on behalf of Jesus, in charity and truth—for the life of the world. The heart of living as a Eucharistic Missionary is being united to Jesus in his own perfect offering to the Father, which we re-live in a mysterious way at every Mass!

When the priest or deacon says, "The Mass is ended. Go in the peace of Christ," Please go! What you have heard, touched and tasted, you must share with others!


