REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

"Who do People say that I am" (Mark 8:27-35)

This Sunday Jesus asks his disciples a crucial question, "who do you say that I am?" Peter responds, "You are the Christ." As Jesus taught them that as Christ, he has to undergo suffering, death, and rise on the third day. Peter began to rebuke Jesus. He cannot reconcile with the idea of the suffering and death through which Jesus was fulfilling his mission as Christ. He does not seem to hear that Jesus gives him the end of the story; that the suffering is something only to be passed through, and like, Christ we will also overcome suffering and death by sharing in the resurrection of the Lord.

The first reading from Isaiah about the suffering servant is fulfilled in Jesus as He explains how He was bringing salvation to the world. It involves denying oneself and taking up the cross. Following Jesus means accepting His path, even when it is difficult. Jesus calls us to take up our cross and follow Him. This means we may face challenges and hardships as part of our faith journey. Following Jesus requires sacrifice. We may have to give up our own desires and face difficulties. But by doing so, we find true life in Christ.

The second reading today from the letter of James shows us how the following of Christ is translated into action and what it means to be a follower of Christ. Faith must be active and shown through works. If one encounters a brother or sister without adequate clothing or food or shelter, to deny oneself and take up the cross (sacrifice) to help the neediest ones. Simply talking about faith, but not making it visible, in concrete deeds of self-surrender is not authentic discipleship. Helping others and living out our faith go hand in hand. When we help those in need, we show the love of God in action. Our faith becomes alive and active through our good works.

Being a Christian means personally entrusting ourselves to Jesus, picking up our cross daily, and living according to His teachings. Let us recognize opportunities to deny ourselves and do God's will, leading to personal growth and positive change in the world.

Year of Mission – Eucharistic Revival *Be an Instrument of the Good Shepherd*

Jesus showed us just how deeply he cherishes every soul when he shared the parable of the Good Shepherd, who left the ninety-nine to seek out the one lost sheep. He is inviting each of us to be his hands and feet in a special way, during this Year of Mission by reaching out to those who are lost or have wandered away from his Church, accompanying them on their journey home. This initiative is called *Walk With One*. It isn't a communal call—it's a personal one. **YOU** are invited to be God's instrument in the life of **one other person**. Will you answer the call?


