



Anointing of the Sick Will be celebrated the last weekend of the month after all Masses. Also, you may request anointing by calling the pastor or the parish office.





REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

"If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off"

In the first reading today, from the Book of Numbers, Moses explains that God can choose anyone to share His spirit. This story teaches us that God's spirit is not limited. God can work through anyone, regardless of where they are. We should be open to seeing God's work in unexpected places and people. When we accept that God's spirit can be present in anyone, we become more inclusive. We see that everyone has the potential to share God's message. This helps us to appreciate the diverse ways God works in the world.

In the second reading, James speaks against those who hoard wealth while others suffer. James warns the rich about the misuse of wealth. Wealth should be used to help others, not just for personal gain. Helping those in need is a key part of living our faith.

In the Gospel (Mark 9:38-43), the disciples try to stop someone casting out demons in Jesus' name. Jesus teaches them to recognize and support good works done by others. Jesus says anyone who does good in His name is part of His mission. This teaches us to be open and inclusive.

In the second part of the gospel today, Jesus warns about the seriousness of sin. Jesus does not take sin lightly - and neither should we. Sin persists in human beings after the Fall. All of us are prone to fall and sin. He uses strong language to show how important it is to avoid sin at all costs and focuses on avoiding sin by removing temptations.

He is also warning us not only about our own sins, but also about causing others to sin and stresses the importance of cutting off sources of temptation, symbolized by hands, feet, and eyes. While Jesus' words are not literal, we must take practical steps to avoid sinful actions, places, and things we consume. All our choices and actions have consequences during our lifetime here and also the eternal consequences, the danger of losing eternal life with him.

Year of Mission – Eucharistic Revival Encountering the Eucharist Changes Us

In the Eucharist, we encounter God face to face. In Holy Communion, we participate in Jesus' divine life, His thoughts become our thoughts, his words become our words, and his actions become our actions. We become what we consume. In attending Mass, we don't simply recall Jesus' Paschal Mystery, what he did to save us, we *relive* it. Participation in the Mass is a call to action. The Eucharist sends us forth to see in others the face of Christ. When we participate in the Eucharistic Liturgy, we become part of a community of believers loved by Jesus. We receive him and are sent to share him with others.
