

REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

"Ephphatha!'- that is, Be Opened!" (Mark 7:31-37)

In today's gospel, people bring to Jesus a man with a hearing and speech impediment and beg him to lay his hands on him. Jesus takes the man away from the crowd, touches the man's ears and tongue, and pronounces a word in Aramaic: "Ephphata!" – that is 'Be Opened.' We hear these words in the Rite of Baptism, as the celebrant blesses the ears and mouth to be open and able to receive and preach the Word of God. Baptism is the sacrament of salvation, opening the way once closed by sin. We follow the pattern of Jesus' healing today with our sacraments, using not only words but also physical touch, and the tangible signs of oil, water, bread and wine, which have power to transform our lives. Through Jesus' power the man's ears are opened and his speech becomes clear.

Jesus's healing work often involves opening what is closed. We hear in our first reading from Isaiah the prophesy of how the Messiah will restore creation to the wholeness God intended for it. "The eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared." The prophet preaches a truth that frankly can be difficult to believe at times: that God will transform our hurting, broken world. We are blessed to live in this Messianic age when the Lord opens our eyes and ears to see him and listen to him believing that God will make all things whole again.

The physical ability to hear is not necessary for such an encounter with Christ; nor is the physical ability to speak necessary to proclaim the word of God. It is openness of mind, heart and spirit to the breath of God within and without, and the willingness to respond wholeheartedly that are essential. In the second reading from the letter of James, it is clear that openness to God also results in our openness to others, especially those who are poor, and the most vulnerable. There should be no partiality, he says, because God shows no partiality.

Today's healing miracle in the gospel is a great lesson for us. Jesus tells us to be open to God's calling, to the work of healing, to caring for our neighbor in need.

Receiving the Eucharist is meant to change us. Entering into communion with Jesus is meant to make us increasingly like him—to see how he sees, to think how he thinks, and to love how he loves; receiving the Eucharist empowers us to live supernaturally; being in union with Jesus in the Eucharist imparts new responsibilities for how we live, especially in our relationships.
