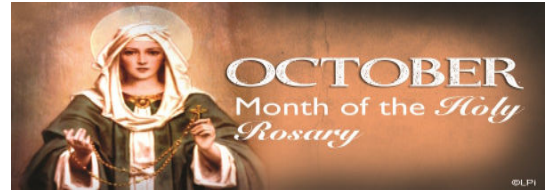

REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way. (Mk 10:52)

In today's gospel reading we meet a man who recognized Jesus as the Son of God who came to this world to lead us from darkness to light, fulfilling the promise we heard in the first reading that the Lord will bring back His people and heal their wounds (Jer 31:7-9). Jeremiah envisions a world in which those who are blind and lame are brought to God.

Jesus in the gospel is on his way to Jerusalem to complete his saving act, now leaving Jericho and coming across Bartimaeus, a blind man. Jesus, after a powerful exchange between them, heals him and gives him a new vision and direction. The church fathers see physical healings as signs of deeper spiritual healing and awakening. Bartimaeus' story reminds us that many are spiritually blind and cannot see God's plan for their lives. This powerful healing encounter encourages us to cry out to the Lord and help others who are struggling to find their way. By bringing them to Jesus, we help them see and live God's plan of goodness.

Bartimaeus' healing symbolizes spiritual awakening and salvation. Living in sin makes us spiritually blind, but like Bartimaeus, we must call out to Jesus for mercy. Our faith leads to true sight and discipleship. Bartimaeus represents all of us, called out of the "city of sin" into a life with Christ. We are to respond to Jesus' call and follow Him on the way. The second reading from Hebrews talks about the high priest who offers gifts and sacrifices for sins. This priest understands human weakness and has compassion. Jesus is our High Priest who is merciful and loving. He offers himself as a sacrifice for our sins. This shows His great love for us and His desire to bring us closer to God.

Jesus is heading to Jerusalem, knowing He will face rejection there. He has been talking about His coming sacrifice and the need to give everything for His mission. He also calls His disciples to do the same. Bartimaeus did not just gain his sight, he chose to follow Jesus. Bartimaeus has the faith and courage to leave his cloak and everything behind to follow Jesus. He is willing to follow, run, leap, and shout the good news about Jesus. As his disciples, this is a great example for us to follow to spread the good news of salvation around us.

Jesus is truly present in the tabernacle. Don't leave Him alone! It's a very simple thing; you, the electrician; you, the salesman; you, the attorney; you, the mom; you the grandpa; you, the child... to open a church door and say, "hi, Jesus, it's Billy. I play shortstop. I hope You have a good day." If you do that, Jesus will grow in your heart, your faith will get stronger, and you will never leave Him. Open the door, recharge your faith, deepen your relationship with Christ.

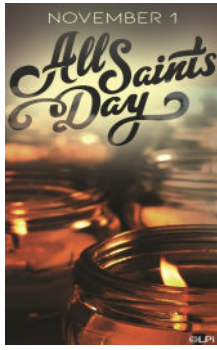

Mass Intention Guidelines for our Parish

- The Mass offering is \$20 per intention, as determined by Archdiocesan policy.
- Requests are honored on a first come first-served basis.
- A Maximum of 3 intentions will be accepted at one time (No more than 1 per month, 1 weekend Mass and 2 weekday Masses or 3 weekday Masses)
- A maximum of 6 Masses per calendar year can be requested for any one intention (2 weekend and 4 weekday)
- We also encourage you also to give the additional mass intentions to the parish office and we will arrange with retired priests or religious/missionary priests to offer Masses for your intentions.

Please Note: Parish Office will be closed on Friday, November 1st for the Holy Day.
