REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

Love God and Love your Neighbor as Yourself

In today's Gospel from **Mark 12:28-34**, Jesus is asked about the greatest commandment, and He responds by summarizing the law with two commands: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength" and "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

These two commandments are inseparable, drawing us into a life of complete love for God and one another. Jesus teaches that love isn't simply a feeling but a commitment that encompasses our whole being – our thoughts, our desires, our actions, and our relationships. True love of God spills over into love for others; when we encounter God's love, it compels us to reflect that love outward.

To love our neighbor as ourselves is to see others with compassion, to care for their well-being, and to treat them with the same dignity we desire for ourselves. This commandment calls us to humility and service, reminding us that every person is a beloved child of God.

Let us ask for the grace today to deepen our love for God and to let that love transform the way we love one another. May our hearts, minds, and actions reflect this greatest of commandments, uniting us in faith and love.

This weekend we remember our family members and friends who have died, and pray for the repose of their souls in heaven, we do this with immense hope, because we know that those who seek Jesus, and the love he offers us, are never rejected. We look toward that last day, alongside those whose physical presence we have lost, but whose spiritual hope we share. We give thanks to God for their lives and all the blessings and love we received through them.

As our nation approaches Election Day, let us come together in prayer and we ask for God's guidance upon our country, that His wisdom may guide all citizens and leaders in the path of peace, unity and the common good. Let us entrust our nation to God's care, seeking His will and blessing for our future.
