Archbishop-Designate of Milwaukee Most Reverend Jeffrey S. Grob

A native of Cross Plains, Wisconsin, the Most Reverend Jeffrey S. Grob attended Holy Name High School Seminary in Madison and the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio. He was ordained to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Chicago in 1992 and completed his graduate studies at the University of St. Mary of the Lake, Mundelein Seminary in 1999. He received a [Doctorate of Canon Law](#) degree from St. Paul University and a [Doctorate of Philosophy](#) degree from the [University of Ottawa](#) in 2007.

Bishop Grob has served as Associate Pastor and Pastor of several Archdiocese of Chicago parishes, Assistant to the Chancellor, Associate Vicar for Canonical Services, Judicial Vicar, and Chancellor. He was appointed an auxiliary bishop of Chicago on September 11, 2020, and ordained to the episcopacy by Cardinal Blase Cupich on November 13, 2020.

Born March 19, 1961 in Madison, Wisconsin, Bishop Grob is the son of Gerald and Bonnie (Meinholz) Grob.

Archbishop-Designate Grob's installation as Archbishop of Milwaukee will be January 14, 2025. Until that time, Archbishop ListECKI serves as Apostolic Administrator of the archdiocese.

REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

Generosity and Trust in God

The readings for this weekend invite us to reflect on trusting in God and to be generous with our resources and gifts that come from God. In our first reading from the book of Kings, we see a widow who is struggling to survive. She has very little, but when Elijah asks her for food, she trusts God's promise and shares what she has. Her trust leads to a miracle, as her jar of flour and jug of oil do not run out.

This widow's faith is an example for us. Even when we have little, we can trust in God's promises. Her story shows us that God provides for those who put their faith in Him. In our lives, we often face pressures to rely on ourselves or on material things. The widow reminds us to trust in God instead. By doing so, we open ourselves to God's blessings, just as she did.

The story of the widow's mite in **Mark 12:38-44** is a powerful example of generosity and sacrifice. The widow gives all she has, even though it means she will have nothing left. Her sacrifice is real and comes from her deep trust in God. No one notices her but Jesus. Her faith and trust are pure, and her sacrifice shows her deep love for God.

Jesus upholds the poor widow's offering for his disciples' consideration, commending her because her small offering was an act of profound generosity, giving from her livelihood rather than her surplus. To give from our livelihood is not only an act of generosity, it is also an act of trust in God. We can only give from our need if we trust that God will provide for us. Jesus himself demonstrates the ultimate act of generosity and trust in God as he gives his life for us on the cross. The widow's example challenges us. Are we willing to give all we have to God? Her story encourages us to trust in God's care, even when it is difficult. True sacrifice is giving without expecting anything in return.

As we reflect on these readings, I am so grateful for the generosity and selfless giving of everyone who makes it possible to run our parish and reach out to the poor and needy with all our wonderful ministries. Though our parish is not rich, we are rich in generosity and selfless giving. I am so proud of each one of you supporting our parish and its mission through your prayers, time, talents and treasures. May the Lord reward us for our generosity and sacrifices.

UNCERTAINTY! We all experience it, and none of us is particularly fond of it. The uncertainty of everyday life, will it rain or shine, or the oscillating moods of family members or co-workers. Some of us experience long-term uncertainties around health or financial stability. Help us to respond to the uncertainties of life by placing our faith in the certainty of your unconditional love, and to allow that love to bear great fruit in our lives through, with, and in you. Love is at the heart of our Eucharistic Missionary call.

We have well over 100 total volunteers who twice a month donate food, paper goods, and time to the **St. Ben's Community Meal**. The food items needed to make the sandwiches, and then the additional food items (fresh fruit, string cheese, desserts, hard boiled eggs, condiments, and a salty snack) plus the paper bags, ziplock bags, and napkins, that are used to put the 150 bags together, are all donated. Then there is the team that makes the sandwiches, bags the items, and places them in donated boxes for transport. The people who wait for items to be delivered, and the ones who transport the food to St. Ben's all donate their time, as does another crew who donates their time to serve once at month down at the Community meal.
