The Holy Catholic Church celebrates the Jubilee Year 2025 with the opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica by Pope Francis on December 24th, the eve of Christmas. The doors represent the passage to salvation Jesus opened to humanity. A jubilee year, also known as a "holy

year," is a special year in the life of the church currently celebrated every 25 years.

The theme of the Holy Year is "Pilgrims of Hope." In announcing the year of Jubilee, Pope Francis stated, "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision." In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring. May the Jubilee be an opportunity to be renewed in hope. God's word helps us find reasons for that hope.

For our parish, may the Jubilee be a moment of genuine, personal encounter with the Lord Jesus, the 'door' ... of our salvation, whom the Church is charged to proclaim always, everywhere and to all as 'our hope.'

REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

The Feast of the Holy Family

The Feast of the Holy Family offers us a chance to reflect on the values that strengthen our families. By looking at the examples of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, we learn about respect, love, and finding our place in God's family. These reflections help us understand how to live these virtues in our daily lives and grow closer to God.

The Holy Family is unique. There is only one. Yet their holiness is a model for all families. We are all called to be holy families: in our homes, in our parish, and in our communities. Let us consider the ways in which this family was founded. Mary founded this family by her *yes to God*, her faithful acceptance of God's will. The Holy Family reminds us of our place in God's family. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph show us the importance of family bonds. Jesus grew in wisdom by understanding His place in His Father's house. We are also called to find our place in God's family. It might not always be what we want, but through prayer and discernment, we can understand God's will for us.

The Holy Family is marked by **trust in God's revelation**. Like Mary, Joseph received divine counsel in a dream and he heeds the angelic advice. He showed great courage, not only in going against human understanding and marrying Mary despite her pregnancy, but also in taking his family out of their home and to a foreign country. Parents, filled with love, often express God's care to their family by going to great lengths to protect them.

The Holy Family is marked by reliance on God's Providence. Mary and Joseph did not know what was to be, only that they were accepting a piercing task: to raise a child who was the glory of Israel and a sign to be contradicted. Yet they received these words with amazement and proceeded to raise the Christ child in faith and in love. Similarly, we too, enter into marriage, family, or a religious community without knowing fully how our lives will unfold. Yet we are given the invitation to commit ourselves to God's work - just as Jesus was presented in the temple. Even though we do not know the joys and sorrows we will face in this life, we can cling to the source of light and peace, in whom joy is unending. May we trust in God's presence and Providence, not just like the Holy Family but also with the Holy Family.
