

REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

"Do whatever he tells you"

John 2:5

This Sunday we begin the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. The readings of this Sunday offer us important lessons about the gifts of the Holy Spirit, unity in diversity, transformation through Christ, and the role of Mary in our lives.

In the second reading Paul talks about the Holy Spirit giving different gifts to people. These gifts are meant to help the community and show God's love. Each person receives a gift that can be used to help others. No one person has all the gifts, so we need each other. When we use our gifts together, we can do great things for our community and the Church.

Paul also teaches about unity in diversity. Even though we have different gifts, they all come from the same Spirit. This means that our differences should not divide us but bring us together. Diversity is a strength, not a weakness. Each person's unique gift is necessary for the Church to function well. When we embrace our differences, we can create a more vibrant and effective community. Let us celebrate our different talents and work together for a common goal. This will help us grow in love and unity as a community.

The Gospel tells the story of the wedding at Cana. Jesus' first miracle of turning water into wine is a sign of His divinity and the fulfillment of God's promise to Israel. The abundance of wine symbolizes the overflowing grace and life that Jesus brings. This miracle shows Jesus' power and care for others. Jesus' action at Cana also symbolizes how He can transform our lives. Just as He changed water into wine, He can change our hearts and make us new. Let us reflect on this miracle by thinking about areas in our lives that need change. Let us ask Jesus to help us grow and improve. By trusting in His power, we can experience positive changes and become better followers of Christ.

Mary's role in the wedding at Cana is also highlighted in the Gospel. She notices that the wine has run out and asks Jesus to help. Her faith and care for others are evident in her actions. She serves as an example of faith and intercession. Just as she asked Jesus to help at the wedding, we can ask her to intercede for us with her Son especially for our parish community as she is our patroness of our parish. Let us follow her example by bringing our needs to Jesus and believing in His power to help.




Year of Mission
