

REFLECTIONS FROM FR. MATTHEW

"Go, and from now on do not sin anymore"

In today's Gospel (John 8:1-11), we witness a powerful encounter between Jesus and a woman caught in adultery. The scribes and Pharisees bring her before Jesus, not out of concern for justice, but to trap Him. They demand a verdict: Should she be stoned, as the law of Moses prescribes?

Jesus responds not with condemnation but with mercy. He says, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." One by one, her accusers walk away. Finally, Jesus looks at the woman and speaks those profound words: "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore."

These words capture the heart of Lent: God's mercy is greater than our sins. Jesus does not ignore sin, but He does not define us by our failures. Instead, He forgives and invites us to a new life. His mercy is not a license to continue in sin but an opportunity to begin again.

Lent calls us to this renewal. As we prepare for Holy Week, we reflect on Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection—the ultimate act of God's love, which makes this new life possible. Through His sacrifice, He takes away our sins and gives us the grace to walk in holiness.

Like the woman in the Gospel, we are invited to hear Jesus' words spoken to us: "Neither do I condemn you." But we must also embrace His challenge: "Go, and from now on do not sin any more." With God's grace, we can leave behind old habits and embrace a life of love, truth, and holiness.

As we approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation and prepare our hearts for Easter, let us trust in the mercy of Jesus. He does not condemn us—He forgives, restores, and calls us to new life. Amen.
